Suspicion of a case of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in the Ardennes

Mad Cow Disease is back

USPA NEWS - There is a suspicion of a case of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) was detected in a cow Salers breed, after an operation of the Ardennes. The suspicion was established on March 17 by the national laboratory of reference the National Agency of Health Safety (ANSES).

The disease may be most easily transmitted to human beings by eating food contaminated with the brain, spinal cord or digestive tract of infected carcasses. However, the infectious agent, although most highly concentrated in nervous tissue, can be found in virtually all tissues throughout the body, including blood. In humans, it is known as new variant Creutzfeldt""Jakob disease (vCJD or nvCJD), and by June 2014 it had killed 177 people in the United Kingdom, and 52 elsewhere. Between 460,000 and 482,000 BSE-infected animals had entered the human food before controls on high-risk offal introduced chain were 1989.----
